Sadly, many in our world choose not to concern themselves with such questions. Their world is reduced to their personal economics and, provided they are in reasonable shape, such people get along just fine.

Christians will (should) have some degree of distress of soul.

Our world is full of people who are full of doubts about God, but they never express those doubts to God.

How can you begin to understand God if you are not going to the place (church) and using the resource (Bible) that will help you find God?

Many form theology based off of what they think and hear, as opposed to direct questioning and direct study.

We end up creating our own gods and religions and we simply discard anything we do not like or understand.

We feel we have the right to an answer for every question, a solution for every problem. We want God to line up with our thoughts and our timelines.
